

# ARTHINGTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

## At last, a SID for Arthington Lane!

The parish council is very pleased to announce that, at long last, a Speed Indication Device (a smiley faced SID) is to be placed on Arthington Lane. For many years Arthington Lane has suffered from speeding vehicles including HGVs thundering through the village. The police and Leeds Highways officers considered Arthington Lane to be a priority site for a SID. As one of the main arteries from parts of North Yorkshire to Otley and beyond, it carries high volumes of traffic and is one of the most dangerous roads in northern Leeds.

The funding for the SID, which will be solar powered, has been provided by ward Councillor Billy Flynn. The presence of a SID should help to reduce the speed of traffic and make the road safer for Arthington residents.

## Site Allocations Plan

There is only one site in Arthington Parish which has been affected by the housing proposals in this plan. This is the land to the rear of 45 Creskeld Lane which is located in the Bramhope part of the parish.

Leeds City Council are, on the recommendations of the planning inspectors, intending to make modifications to the plan. Consequentially Leeds will be proposing that the Creskeld Lane site remain in the Green Belt until at least 2023, after which it will remain in the Green Belt unless they can justify the removal.

If the housing requirement for Leeds is reduced, to a new proposed figure of below 52,000 homes, via a Core Strategy Selective Review, then this site could not be considered as a potential housing site until after 2033.
